ODE - DÉMOS EUROPEAN ORCHESTRA

Concert at the Philharmonie de Paris – Grande Salle Pierre Boulez Saturday, 26 February 2022, 8 p.m.

From 1 January 2022 to 30 June 2022, France holds the Presidency of the Council of the European Union. For the occasion, the Philharmonie de Paris will take part in an ambitious and highly symbolic project by hosting an orchestra of 120 young people from the 27 EU Member States (Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Republic of Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and Sweden).



These young people, aged 12 to 17, were selected by a network of partners on the basis of musical and social criteria similar to those of Démos, a musical and orchestral education outreach programme, that the Philharmonie has led for the last 11 years. Each Member State is represented by 2 to 6 musicians.

After having worked on the concert programme in their respective countries, the young musicians will meet in Paris starting on 19 February 2022, hosted by the Philharmonie, where they will follow an intensive rehearsal schedule. They will be mentored by professional musicians and led by orchestral conductors Corinna Niemeyer and Rebecca Tong, a laureate of the La Maestra 2022 competition. This will also be an opportunity for them to discover Paris and to connect with fellow European musicians.

Unlike classic Démos orchestras, the young musicians will perform by themselves on stage, without the support of professional musicians. For the last piece on the programme, they will be joined by the Orchestre de Paris' Children and Youth Choir, with the participation of children from the EVE project (which in French stands for "Together we Exist with our Voice").

The week will come to a close on Saturday, 26 February 2022 with a concert performed in the Grande Salle Pierre Boulez, attended by representatives of the EU Member States and of the Commission and the Parliament, in addition to other young musicians from the Île-de-France region.
